

For a Healthy Welcoming of Francophone Immigrants to Nunavut Current Situation

In 10 years, Nunavut's immigrant population has doubled. In 2006, 5.5% of the Francophone population was immigrant versus 8.1% in 2016. The immigrants from Cameroon are the most important Francophone immigrant population in Nunavut (2.2% of immigrants in 2016).

Nunavut does not have a ministry or secretariat dedicated to immigration.

Carrefour Nunavut is the organisation responsible for helping new arrivals get settled in Nunavut.



Breakdown of Francophone immigration in Nunavut[®]



Breakdown of Francophone immigrants to Nunavut:

- 63% come from Africa
- 9 out of 10 respondents passed through one or more Canadian provinces before coming to Nunavut.
- **75%** are between the ages of 25 and 44.
- The average age of francophone immigrants is **43.8 years**.
- **58%** have a post-secondary degree or diploma.
- 80% of respondents state that they are satisfied or pretty satisfied with their employment.
- The median employment revenue in 2015 was \$113,920.

Among francophone immigrant persons:

• 60% of respondents

of respondents state that they are not comfortable or are not always comfortable with the idea of seeking help for physical health concerns in Nunavut:

- o Many mentioned the language barrier.
- 60% of respondents are of the opinion that access to French language services for health care in Iqaluit is insufficient or rarely sufficient.

Language is not the only barrier; there is also the culture, the customs. - Extract - comment from a respondent.

Among health care professionals:

In 2016 in Nunavut, **115 healthcare workers** know French, which represents 9.2% of healthcare workers.

25 healthcare workers

use French in their work, which represents 2% of healthcare workers.
